



MANGO & SESAME SALAD

2 table spoons sesame seeds4 Mangos2 large carrots peeled and grated

- 6 green onions, thinly sliced
- ¼ small green cabbage, finely shredded

Orange tahini dressing

½ cup olive oil
¼ cup fresh orange juice
2 tea spoons castor sugar
1 tea spoon Dijon mustard
1 tablespoon tahini



Cook sesame seeds in a frying pan over high heat, stirring, for 4 minutes or until golden brown. Cool.

MAKE DRESSING – Combine all ingredients with salt & pepper in a screw top jar. Shake well. Prepare mangoes using the cube system, place in a bowl. Add carrots, onions, cabbage, sesame seeds and dressing to mangoes. Toss gently and serve.
