PRESIDENT'S REPORT MARCH 2019

Welcome to the first newsletter of 2019. We are entering one of the most beautiful times of the year, autumn, when it is still lovely and warm - a great time of year to enjoy outdoor activities including paddling, swimming, walking, running and gardening in this lovely part of NSW. Christmas and the January holidays do feel as if they are long gone. The club is as usual busy with activities on and off the water.

The Executive Committee have continued on looking after the Club off the water:

- Our Paddling Roster was updated in December to Version 6 and at most sessions over the warmer months we have had "two boat" sessions, especially Saturday morning and Monday afternoon, our most popular sessions at the moment.
- A proposal by Kath Dayment to hold a movie fundraiser night to help with the expenses of our two Aurora paddlers Peter Reed and Wendy Orman who will represent Australia in Thailand in August this year, was accepted by the committee. Peter stepped out of meeting while this was discussed. Kath is waiting on date from the cinema and as soon as it is locked in, she will organise with the help of members. Thank you Kath.
- We have accepted an invitation to be part of The Forster Keys Progress Association annual Family Fun Day on July 14th which is the beginning of the 2019 -2020 season. The Club will have a stall and offer members of the public over the age of 18 a try at dragon boating. The organisers will promote us in all their fun day marketing and publicity i.e. social media, flyers etc. Last year there were approximately 6000 people attend this so if 1% i.e. 60 people, decide to give dragon boating a go, we will be in a win-win situation. The Club will need member support to either transport boat by water or road, help with stall, waivers, PFD's, paddling with those trying out and generally representing dragon boating in a positive light i.e. as a healthy, social, team sport which can be done for exercise and or competition. Please mark in your diary as this cannot be done with a skeleton crew.
- A "Come and Try Members only" was organised in a very short time frame and was held on 9th February. The member support was tremendous. We tried sweeping, that is 15 of us, drumming, stroking and had a go on the OC1's (single outriggers). Even though the majority of us still need to be trained in capsize and self rescue, this was a good starting point in OC1 use. We have some talented members keen to answer the Club's call and train as sweeps. Unfortunately this is a slow process and will take time, so please don't get discouraged as your time will come. Personally, I have been heartened as some of our newer members have mentioned that they don't mind waiting as they are committed to the club and are here for the long haul. Thanks guys.
- As part of the above we looked closely at the availability of our Sweeps over the coming
 months and at times we may be in a dicey situation in regards to sweep availability due to
 members doing other things such as travelling, competing overseas and also work commitments.
- Daylight saving will finish early April and in the past we have moved the session back to 3.30pm OTW. This has not always been successful due to lack of paddlers and unavailability of coaches and sweeps as quite often they are still working at that time. When these things happen we don't get on the water, often on a very regular basis so we the committee have tried to think outside the square. After much discussion it has been decided we need to be flexible we will continue on with the 5.30 pm OTW and adjust the starting time as we see fit, e.g. we may bring the time back by 15 minutes after a few weeks and so on.

- The committee has been looking at Club Grants and have decided we will apply for two new marquees and possibly a generator. We do have marquees our two bigger ones were purchased second hand. At our November regatta with the onslaught of rain we had to deal with leaks in these plus our new PA system which was purchased with part Club Grants and part club savings needs to be undercover. We feel it is time to upgrade.
- Paddling vouchers have recently been introduced and are available in \$20 or \$50 lots. If you don't wish to be looking for a \$2 coin these might be ideal (keep in paddle bag). At sessions write V instead of Paid next to your name and slip voucher in money bag. See
 Treasurer for purchase

On the weekend a small keen team went to State as part of a Northern Waratahs team and made it to the final of Senior A Open. A fantastic effort with just 7 men in the boat. As we did last year we put together "show bags" which were distributed to teams to promote and encourage attendance at our annual regatta in November.

Nationals is coming up and due to our New Zealand trip and the Nationals being held at Easter (family time) we will only have a small but dedicated team competing. This team has been training hard at regular sessions plus doing additional targeted sessions. The Club wish the team well. Also for the first time the club has subsidised the individual entries.

This coming weekend some of us are paddling in Wellington New Zealand as part of our 10th anniversary season overseas trip and we are all getting excited. We have a huge weekend planned paddling, sightseeing and socialising. It is great to have the two Kath's and Allan on board as they have all been in the club since the beginning.

When we get back there will no rest as all members, partners and ex- members will come together at TBBC on Friday 10th May for our 10th anniversary dinner. The Club will cover dinner costs for financial members while partners, ex members and their partners will pay for their own. More details to come however I think it can be stated we are looking at a happy, joyful night amongst ourselves and hopefully old friends.

After all this excitement we will head to Urunga for their regatta, first weekend in May. I know our members love paddling in the 6 to 8 kilometre race each year on the Saturday - I am never sure of the exact distance as each year it appears to be advertised differently. Anyway, the Club always enjoys Urunga, both Saturday afternoon and Sunday – the fast and furious 200 metre sprints.



Moving on, we have a huge regional regatta calendar coming up. June regatta will be Flamin' Dragons' - newly crowned "NSW Club of the Year". Wow, very deserving. Port have really worked hard the last couple of years. July will see us visit the Rats at Kempsey while August will be a quick trip to support our cousins Manning in their regatta endeavours and September one of my favourites, Coffs Coast, to be held at one of the nicest spots on the coast – Mylestom.

STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS

A great day for the nine Pearlers who made the trip down the expressway to attend the 2019 DBNSW State Championships at the Sydney International Regatta Centre, Penrith on Sunday 3rd March. Our keen paddlers joined Rick Fry and the Northern Waratahs to form four combined teams that competed in the Senior A Mixed team, the Premier Mixed Team, the Senior A Opens Team and the Premier Opens

For those new to the club and dragonboating a few definitions may help you understand.

These are the age divisions that we race in at SIRC, State and National competitions:

Premier: minimum of 12 years of age, no maximum

Senior A: minimum of 40 years of age, no maximum

Senior B: minimum of 50 years of age, no maximum

Senior C: minimum of 60 years of age, no maximum

The race categories are:

Women: all women and a woman steerer (sweep)

Mixed: minimum of 5 male paddlers with a maximum of 10 male paddlers (regional regattas only require 2 males/mixed team)

Opens: any gender with no limits or requirements

Men's: only held in regional regattas require all male paddlers

So it makes it even more impressive when the Senior A Mixed team with only 7 men, made it into the finals.

Our club president, Denise, had myself and Kimmie (female Club Captain), deliver our Great Lakes 'Regatta Bags' to advertise our November 2019 regatta. We visited each club and gave the bags to the club presidents and committee members that attended the State Championships. We worked had to encourage them to visit our lovely area AND have a paddle at the regatta. If initial enthusiasm indicates attendance we may get a few city clubs come to visit us!!

A big thank you to Rick for organising our trip and to our fantastic paddlers for making the trip. How could we not mention our lovely PP - 'Positive Pearler Annie' who loved every minute of her first regatta at Penrith. What a great regatta to start with - the 2019 State Championships!!!


