UPDATE FROM YOUR EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE (EC)

Welcome to 2016. January can be a laid back time in the Great Lakes but not for us Pearlers', we held a very successful working bee and painted our containers. Thank you for your help, who knew painting, could be so much fun and much appreciation to Tuncurry Beach Bowling Club who made this possible through ClubGRANTS NSW.

Looking forward we are going to have another busy, successful year.

Our regatta calendar is full with Chinese New Year, Urunga, and Port Macquarie in the first half of the year plus in June we have our biennial overseas Club trip planned. This time round we are visiting Hong Kong for the Hong Kong International Dragon Boat Races. We have approximately 24 pearlers taking part.

The EC has approved a Tuesday afternoon paddle as a trial; the future of this session will be assessed in February. Reviewing our Club policies is ongoing, we have deleted two, they are the Regatta Management V7 and the Crew Selection V4. She maintains the Pearl Dragons Asset list for the EC (Treasurer) of all Pearl Property.



COACHES CORNER



Moderate/Intensive / Beginners Paddling



The morning sessions during the week are designed to be more intense while the Tues, Thurs (afternoons) and the Saturday morning sessions are a little less intense to cater for those who prefer less vigorous paddling.

However it is the paddlers own ability and/or commitment that determines how they use the sessions.

That means if the levels (percentages) are too hard at any time then just ease off.

The important thing is that you attend, you're not at risk of injury, you do the best you can and that you enjoy your time on the water.

Beginners

Though beginners are welcome at any session it is preferred that they attend some sessions on Tues, Thurs or 2nd run Sat. This will enable them to get to learn the 'Basics' before moving on to other more advanced paddling.

Anyone is welcome to attend though as these sessions tend to become more advanced as paddlers get more experienced.

Things to know

Everyone is welcome at every session

- <u>Swapping sides</u> check with your buddy on the day, what you want to do with your paddles when swapping. Either holding them or laying them crossed in the boat. Either way is fine.
- What to do with your paddle when getting off the boat It has been suggested that we leave our paddles in the boat along the sides to ensure there is a clear space in the middle for us to walk down when getting of the boat. (No trip hazards please).
- If this doesn't suit you, take it to the Wally Table however return immediately to assist in getting the boat off the water. We do have paddlers who need to leave ASAP (work commitments).
- <u>Paddlers</u> are to take direction from the Coach of the session only, unless a safety issues arises, then the sweep will give directions. Hence it is important to have 'Heads in the Boat' at all times
- Regattas The Pearl Dragons like to compete when possible and everybody is welcome.
 - Sometimes they are a day trip sometimes a weekend away. They are always fun!
- <u>Feedback</u> Please feel free to discuss with your coaches any issues/concerns that you may have re the coaching of sessions. Positive & constructive communication is always welcome and will be acted upon if appropriate
- <u>Training Calendar</u> The coaches do work to a training Calendar which has been designed to improve our paddling fitness and ability and should enable us to work towards competing in Regattas at our "Peak Performance" The three stages we work on are: Endurance- Strength- Speed

Dragon boat racing originated in Southern China over 2000 years ago, and started gathering interest in the western world in the 1970s.

Dragon boat racing is enjoyed by people of all ages in over 50 countries and territories around the world.

The 40 foot boat typically has a drummer at the bow, 20 paddlers, and a steersman.

The teams are made up of all women, all men, or mixed.

Dragon boat racing is a flatwater, sprint paddling sport with a style similar to those in sprint canoeing and outrigger racing, using single-blade paddles.

Dragon boat races can range anywhere from 200m up to 2000m, and are typically on a straight away with the exception of a few marathon style races.

It is a recreational and highly competitive sport that is the fastest growing water sport in the world.



The 4th Annual GLPD Regatta

Held Saturday 21 and Sunday 22 November 2015, was a huge success and the committee are looking forward to the challenges of this year's regatta.

The Regatta Committee consisted of Carol Richards, Fay Brooks, Deb Harris, Joanne Harris and Joanne Vakaahi. The committee worked well together and were able to overcome many challenges as this was their first experience organising a regatta.

The Saturday races were an outstanding success with positive feedback from all teams. We had 13 teams compete in the 2K race and 10 teams in the 500m races. These teams consisted of Camden Haven, Central Coast, Coffs Coast, Deepwater, Flaming Dragons, Hunter River/Sth West Rocks/Wallis Spirit Dragons, Hawkesbury River, Manning/Nambucca, Kempsey River Rats, Newcastle Marlins, Newcastle Redfins, Urunga Titavators and of course our own Great Lakes Pearl Dragons. The winners of the 2k race were Central Coast 1st; Newcastle Marlins 2nd; Kempsey River Rats 3rd. The winners of the 500m races were: Central Coast 1st; Kempsey River Rats 2nd; Newcastle Marlins 3rd. A presentation to winners was held at the Lakes and Ocean Hotel. A raffle was conducted at the hotel which was very profitable with all prizes being donated. The Hotel is looking forward to welcoming the teams back this year.

Sunday races all ran smoothly and on time. We had 6 community teams enter the regatta with some teams returning for their 3rd year. These teams were Regional Financial Services, Forster Bowling Club, Gathang Warriors, Cuzzies & Co, The Great Lakes College and the Laughin Asses.

The winning teams were Regional Financial Services, Gathang Warriors and Cuzzies & Co. We conducted an exhibition handicap race for the Zodiacs A & B teams and the TS Manoora Cadets. Then we combined the junior Zodiacs with the Navy Cadets to form 2 teams of equal strength and capabilities who competed in two races.

On Sunday the Sports Men 10's placings were Kempsey River Rats, Newcastle Marlins and Hawkesbury River. The Sports Women's placings were Flaming Dragons Port Macquarie, Manning River Dragons and Kempsey River Rats. The Sports Mixed placings were Central Coast, Flaming Dragons and Kempsey River Rats.

We conducted another raffle on Sunday which was also very profitable again with most prizes donated.

For the first time we had Saul Brady as our Announcer on both Saturday and Sunday. Having Saul there on both days ensured that events rang smoothly and on time. The advertising by the announcer given to sponsors and vendors was well received.

The officials and volunteers were wonderful, all doing their allocated tasks with professionalism and friendliness, especially our members, family and friends of the Pearlers.

- dismantling the site late afternoon



The enthusiasm and commitment from everyone (old & new) is just wonderful – Thank You



FUNDAY WORKING BEE


