President's Report February 2017

Mentioning the cooling of the weather, when this happens and paddler numbers decline, rather than have a session continually cancelled on a Saturday, we will have one session at 7.30am. This session will go for 90 minutes. We have a few stalwarts that like to paddle in two sessions of a Saturday. This way they will have the opportunity to have a longer paddle.

Since our last newsletter, Frank Fenech has been named as an "Aurora". Congratulations Frank. How wonderful for our Club to have two members, Frank and Wendy, paddling for Australia in October 2017, at the IDBF World Nations Championships in China. We will support them in their training and, as friends, will have a fundraiser to help them both with the expenses associated with the travel etc.

In regards to paddling over the next few months, we will compete at State titles (this weekend), Nationals in April and Urunga in May whilst Port Macquarie always hold their regatta on the June long weekend. Good luck to those paddling this weekend, train hard for Nationals and remember at regional regattas we encourage all members to participate.

Looking at our membership it always astounds me just how many "cogs" it takes to keep the wheels of the Great Lakes Pearl Dragons turning. I don't believe in naming names however we have the EC, Coaches and Sweeps who are all committed, work hard and are visible to us all. Then there are those not so visible, mowing around the container, fixing the bridge when vandalised, endlessly maintaining equipment, changing batteries, organising accommodation and transport at regattas, keeping a lookout for new members (inviting them to coffee, making sure their name gets on the roster, their photo taken), ordering uniforms, doing Bunnings' Barbecues and generally doing the 1001 jobs that always need to be done.

Auroras

Two of our team, Frank Fenech and Wendy Orman have been named as Auroras and will compete at the 13th World Nations Championships in China at Dianchi Lake, Kunming during October, from 18th - 23rd.

They qualified through sheer hard work and determination and will work hard to do Australia proud in October.

Who are the Auroras?

The Auroras are Australia's national dragon boating team. Australia

competes strongly on the international stage at World Championship events which take place biennially. We also compete in the Asian Dragon Boat Championships every other year, as well as in the World Cup. The Auroras are one of Australia's few sporting elite that get to compete in mixed crews right up to the very top level. There are also national teams right through from juniors to seniors.

'The Auroras' was adopted for our national team, and has been embraced by the Australian Dragon Boat community. It is a unique label, and joins other national team brands like the Wallabies, Opals, Socceroos and Matildas as a powerful sporting national identity.

To make Frank and Wendy's journey a little easier we would like to do a fundraiser on their behalf.

This will be one event only and is in addition to any fundraising the Club will have in 2017.

All GLPD first aid kits have recently been checked and restocked. There is a small emergency kit in each of our boats and a Work Health & Safety compliant kit in the container. This contains ice packs, adhesive dressing's antiseptic spray and bandages plus other items that may be needed.

We remind everyone that members are required to read the GLPD Risk Warning Policy as provided on the GLPD website when you join the Club and again when you renew your membership. Members are encouraged to disclose to Great Lakes Pearl Dragons any physical or medical condition that they have that may be exacerbated by training and/or competing in dragon boating.

Paddling

When attending paddling session:

- \Rightarrow wear shoes
- \Rightarrow carry torch (when dark) walk down in groups if possible
- \Rightarrow apply sunscreen, wear hat and apply bug spray (if necessary)
- \Rightarrow be hydrated, bring water
- \Rightarrow respect our neighbours to and from early morning paddles ...sshhh (be quiet 7.00am is still early)
- ⇒ respect our neighbours in regards to parking of cars (driveways, garbage bins) park close together

Uniforms

The Executive Committee encourages members to wear club uniform shirts at training sessions, particularly those sessions on **Thursday**, **Saturday and Sunday** when the boat is on display to spectators on the foreshores of Breckenridge Channel.

Paddling Fees

Members pay \$2 per session to paddle. As the GLPD membership fee is kept to a minimum, we the Club, depend on the paddling session fee to cover our associated expenses.
